In 2003 I started working at WindReach as the Assistant Therapeutic Riding Manager and was delighted to take on the role of Stable Manager in 2007 where I remained for an additional 9 years. And today I am sitting in front of this computer writing an introduction to our Programme Report as the recently appointed Executive Director. I am beyond thrilled to be back with the WindReach team!

I'm thankful to the Board of Directors, staffing team, volunteers and participants for helping make my transition to WindReach seamless. Being part of the WindReach village is wonderful and I can attest that there really isn't a better environment to be part of; one where everyone involved is working towards the same goal – providing robust, meaningful, person centered experiences and sessions.

The Adult Day Programme continues to purposeful and provide meaningful activities to enrich the quality of life of Bermuda's ageing population, including with livina Alzheimer's and those Dementia. One of the notable milestones during 2023 was that we had the need to hire a fulltime Assistant Programme Coordinator. Demara Maybury, joined our team in January and this allowed us to build capacity and offer another full day of programming, moving from four to five days a week.

The 9.5 acres that WindReach occupies gives us the unique advantage of providing a variety of diverse activities for seniors which are both indoors and outdoors. Activities include: arts & crafts, gardening, seated exercise, animal interaction, adaptive sports, cognitive activities, gatherings social and occasionally community visits. Our horticultural therapy sessions were a big hit and on a typical day you would find the seniors tending to their crops whilst listening to the smooth sounds of artists, such as Bill Withers.


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WindReach gets five more acres in Warwick

From 4.5 to 9.5 acres!

A spokesperson for the WindReach Bermuda Trust said: "The recent permanent transfer of the 5 acres adjacent to the current WindReach Bermuda Trust property not only ensures the long-term existing use, such as providing turnout paddocks for our therapeutic horses, but also opens up new opportunities to serve the wider Bermuda community."

"The donation of the additional land will allow WindReach to preserve this diverse and rare property, which includes an old lime kiln and quarry, for future generations. WindReach is considering a range of uses for the additional acreage including maintaining access to the Railway Trail, agricultural use, an outdoor classroom for skills training for market gardening, horticulture and property management.

"We are delighted and very excited at the opportunities this creates for our users and the benefits it brings to the wider Bermuda community."

A WindReach representative added: "We are enormously grateful for the tremendous opportunity the additional land represents. It is rare to find a mature woodland of this size in Bermuda and we're delighted to have been entrusted with it. Environmental stewardship is one of our core values in our recently published strategic plan and we're acutely aware of the obligation on us to ensure that we manage our natural environment for generations to come."



Life Skills Programme

The Life Skills Programme had another great year! Participants engaged in activities such as baking, gardening and animal care, all whilst working on their person goals. Participants in CREW (Creating Real Life Experiences at WindReach) enjoyed community outings and also created artwork that was entered in the Bermuda Society for the Arts, MindFrame exhibit on January of 2024

One of the highlights of 2023 was that our Supportive Volunteering Programme (Level 1) started. This programme provided the option for individuals with diverse support needs to volunteer at WindReach with individualized support in place. Our staff provided training and modelling of volunteer tasks around the property, visual schedules and visual aids. The programme offered the opportunity for individuals to gain training for an hour each week within either Janitorial/Hospitality, Administration, Animal Care or Horticulture tasks, followed by 2 hours of independent volunteer tasks around the WindReach site.



Therapeutic Riding Programme

Throughout 2023, we celebrated and highlighted the impact that Therapeutic Riding has had on the lives of individuals with diverse support needs.


Bermuda is the fourth oldest country to engage individuals in this form of therapy. We follow behind Denmark, UK and Germany. Therapeutic Riding was formally introduced to Bermuda by The Bermuda Riding for The Disabled Association in 1973 and was first housed at a local riding school. It was granted charitable status and accepted as an Associated Overseas Group of the Riding for the Disabled Association in the U.K. The Association then became a limited company and changed its name to the Bermuda Riding for theDisabled Ltd. in October 1995. In December 1996, the BRD was fortunate enough to be given its own custom-built facility at WindReach by the late Mr. Alexander 'Sandy' Mitchell OBE (WindReach's founder) and the WindReach Trustees.

Our Therapeutic Riding Programme continues to positively impact our participants and we look forward to offering this form of therapy for many years to come!

Imo-ja is such a brave young man who faced his fears head on for approximately six months! Week after week, with the assistance of a team of volunteers and our Therapeutic Riding Manager, he enjoyed doing groundwork with the ponies, whilst longing to be with his classmates as they were riding.

Each week Imo-ja's inner superhero would encourage him to get ready, put on the riding helmet and approach the mounting block.... although apprehensively, all whilst the team supported his decisions. Was this the day? Using the person-centered approach, they would gently coach him to mount and readied themselves to assist. No, today would not be the day. This would have to wait for another time.

As the months passed Imo-ja's confidence increased and he was now climbing the mounting block and putting one foot in the stirrup! The team's excitement for him grew as they knew they were getting close to the realization of Imo-ja's goal. They tried different therapy ponies and methodologies to assist Imo-ja.

Lenny, our youthful paint breed, loved the opportunity to help! The instructors' lesson plan on this particular day was to try and use the black and white markings on Lenny's coat to

encourage Imo-ja to get closer to his goal of sitting on the pony. Imo-ja put his foot in the stirrup and stood up lifting his leg half way across the saddle before stepping back down to the security of the mounting block. It was a great session...not the result we wanted for Imo-ja...but we were getting closer and the special moment was fast approaching.

The day that everyone had been anticipating was momentous! Each week, leading up to the big day Imo-ja was working on lifting his leg up higher and higher (he wanted to do it himself and was adamant that he did not want anyone to lift him) Imo-ja approached the mounting block, put his foot in the stirrup as he'd done for many weeks now.. but this time he lifted his leg all the way over and was sitting in the saddle! He was shocked that he'd done it, but was equally pleased! Imo-ja was delighted and squealed with joy as our gentle giant Bo, the therapy pony, did what he loves doing best. He had an amazing first ride and told us he actually really liked riding, it was so fun and he was so proud of himself for being a brave boy. His classmates were all thrilled that Imo-ja rode and that he would be joining them in the arena. When he dismounted, they all gave him an amazing group hug. (seen above)

2023 marked 50 years of therapeutic riding in Bermuda and this form of therapy has empowered individuals, like Imo-ja, to soar high and has helped to enrich their quality of life!


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
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


During the early stages of 2023, our Board and Staff Team commenced the Strategic Planning Process.














MEASURABLE OUTCOMES...


We agree with Toshiko Kamei, from the University of Melbourne, when she wrote, "An underlying assumption of learning progressions is that the skill to be measured can be structured in a way that describes increasing proficiency in skills and knowledge as students learn and develop. Thus, rather than describing a can-or-cannot conclusion about outcomes, assessments based on learning progressions aim to infer a student's level of achievement on a developmental continuum."

2023 BY THE NUMBERS...

In summary there were a total of **1,207 individual beneficiaries** of our Educational and Therapeutic programmes in 2023. Of that number **140 were enrolled** and attended sessions on a **weekly** basis. Our **total attendances** to sessions/lessons for the year was **5,973**!
